Dear Parent/Carer

With the start of the new term now only a few days away I would like to take this opportunity to provide an update about our plans and outline the most important pieces of information for the coming weeks.

As stated in the letter at the end of the summer term, we are keenly aware that the reopening of our school raises challenges on a number of levels. With most students being out of school for more than five months they may feel anxious about returning, worried about getting back into a routine, concerned about the time out of school that could have affected their learning and also their own friendship and social groups. All our plans for the new term are based around the principle of making school safe and secure, providing structure and support so that the students can be as happy and comfortable as possible. Further to this, I would like to remind you to respond to the questions on the linked googleform <https://forms.gle/f8oRpuXzoPoKciiG7> in time for our return in September. Thanks to all of you who have already done this and can those who have not yet done so please complete the form by **2 September 2020 at the latest** – it will only take a few minutes of your time and will reinforce our support plans.

As highlighted previously, our plans for September are based around following the government guidance which states that students should be placed in year group 'bubbles', limiting contact and interaction with other year groups. It will be really helpful if you go through the attached document again and discuss it with your child, because although we have done everything possible to keep school feeling as 'normal' as possible, there are a number of key changes to our daily routines. The main points are as follows:

- The school building will not open until 8.40am every day. Students are encouraged to walk or ride to school and should try to time their arrival in line with the school opening. They should have coats and outdoor clothing to provide protection from the weather as needed.
- While some schools in Bury are making packed lunches for all students compulsory, this is something that we have avoided and we will be providing hot snacks and lunches. However, there is no doubt that risk will be minimised if students bring in their own lunch and we do encourage as many as possible to do so.
- From late October, all students will be provided with a card to make contactless payments on their school dinner accounts. However, until that point all payments can only be made using the online system – cash cannot be brought into school for dinner payments. If you are not registered for the online system then please do so through www.bury.gov.uk/payforit (and select 'School payments'). If you need to know your child's UPR number, then ring our school office (0161 763 1434 or email school through the main address).

Our staff are keen for the start of the new term and we look forward to seeing the students arrive to school wearing the right uniform and looking smart and well presented. Girls should not alter the length of the skirt and jewellery remains banned, while trainers are not part of the uniform and standard school shoes should be worn by all students. All students should be aware of our requirements regarding equipment, with the Elton journal, pens, pencil and



maths equipment all being a daily requirement for all year groups. Our policy for mobile phones remains the same as always and it works well - phones are to be turned off during school hours and are confiscated and returned the following day, if seen to be used by the students. All of these basic expectations help to promote the positive culture across our school which will be reinforced in September with the introduction of a new Reward/Behaviour system. It is based around the three principles of Ready – Respectful – Safe and we look forward to giving more details about how the system works in the next few weeks.

The arrangements for the first few days of the new term are as follows:

- Tuesday and Wednesday (1 and 2 September 2020) are staff training days, with school being closed for students.
- Thursday (3 September 2020) we will be open for our **new Year 7 students only**. They should arrive to school for the usual starting time of 8.45am and the day will finish at 3.00pm.
- Friday (4 September 2020) we will be open for **Year 7 and Year 11 only**, again with the usual start and end times.
- Monday (7 September 2020) we will open to all students from the usual starting time of 8.45am and finishing at 3pm, with the school open fully and to all students from that day onwards. That day will be first that all year groups are in school together and we remind the students to follow the new entrance system into the school. Years 9/10/11 should walk down the main school driveway and they will be directed onto different yard areas by our staff. Years 7/8 should walk down the main path and will be directed to separate waiting areas around the back and side of the main building.

School buses are running as in previous years, though students will obviously be required to wear face masks when travelling on those buses. The 810 and 896 services are in place from Radcliffe, while the 898 and 905 have now been replaced by the Y43 and Y38 respectively, which follow the same route. Details of the bus timetable are attached with this letter and also on our school website.

As always, the guiding principle within Elton High is to develop confident, self-assured young people who can fulfil their academic potential and are supported to be articulate, considerate and socially aware. While our most recent Year 11 students faced real challenges in recent months with the uncertainty and stress caused by the cancellation of exams, it was so rewarding to see them in school on Results Day. Their final GCSE outcomes were outstanding and a very fair reflection on the efforts that they have made with their teachers over the past five years. But more importantly than their results, it was their manner and positive relationships with others which impressed the most and which underlines the 'Elton way' of doing things. They handled the past few months with resilience and maturity and were a credit to our school – we wish them every success for their next steps and look forward to them keeping in touch as they progress with their chosen career paths.

With the return to a full reopening, the 'KIT' bulletin will now be replaced by the 'Elton Times' newsletter which will again be published in the new term and will be emailed every fortnight. The newsletter will continue to provide a detailed update about what is happening across our school and we appreciate you taking the time to read the update when it is released every couple of weeks.

I do hope that this letter and the attached document provide a clear reminder about our processes for the new term. It has been a very difficult period for students, parents and school staff, but the strength of our school is based around us working together and I am confident that we will continue to move from strength to strength even in these more uncertain times.
