Headteacher's Welcome

At the second Presentation Evening, for our former Year 11 students, there was an opportunity to remind those students about taking the next steps in the wider world. Reference was made to a talk given by the former CEO of Apple, Steve Jobs, who made a famous speech to university graduates in 2005, giving advice based on his own work and experiences. This then brought another recent article to my attention, whereby a number of well-known and influential people were asked to recall the best advice they have ever been given. Their responses are varied, but all give some really interesting insights into how we can follow advice to continue making improvements. See below:-

Sir Michael Caine - Actor - '**Champions and stars don't wallow in misfortune, they get up and get on with it.**' This works for everything in life; apply for a job, apply for a course, get in shape, learn a skill. Keep moving and trying new things.

Nadiya Hussain - TV Cook - '**Anger is often more harmful than the injury that caused it.**' My Year 8 teacher told us this - he made us realise how destructive anger can be, making situations worse and distracting from the problem that needs solving.

Sir Mo Farah - Olympic athlete - '**Be willing to adapt.**' It's something my Mum has said to me since I was a kid back home in Somalia. As I got older, it made so much sense - be open to new cultures, new languages, new ideas. Don't expect everything to stay the same. Whatever environment you are thrown into, don't judge and be open minded. There's so much you can achieve, if you are open to it.

Russell T Davies - TV Screenwriter - '**Hold the line.**' My friend said it to me 23 years ago and I've followed it since. Never give up, despite being dealt blows and rejections - always hold the line.

Sir Paul Smith - Fashion designer - '**Keep your feet on the ground.**' We're on the earth for such a short time that health, love and friendship are most important - it's about getting up in the morning, loving life and being optimistic.

Whatever advice we wish to follow, our standard school focus on Ambition / Resilience / Kindness continues to hold firm, and it has been fantastic in recent weeks to see so many students engage with the weekly ARK awards on Thursday afternoons. Details will continue to be promoted on a regular basis in this newsletter and we hope that as many students as possible can continue to get that recognition.

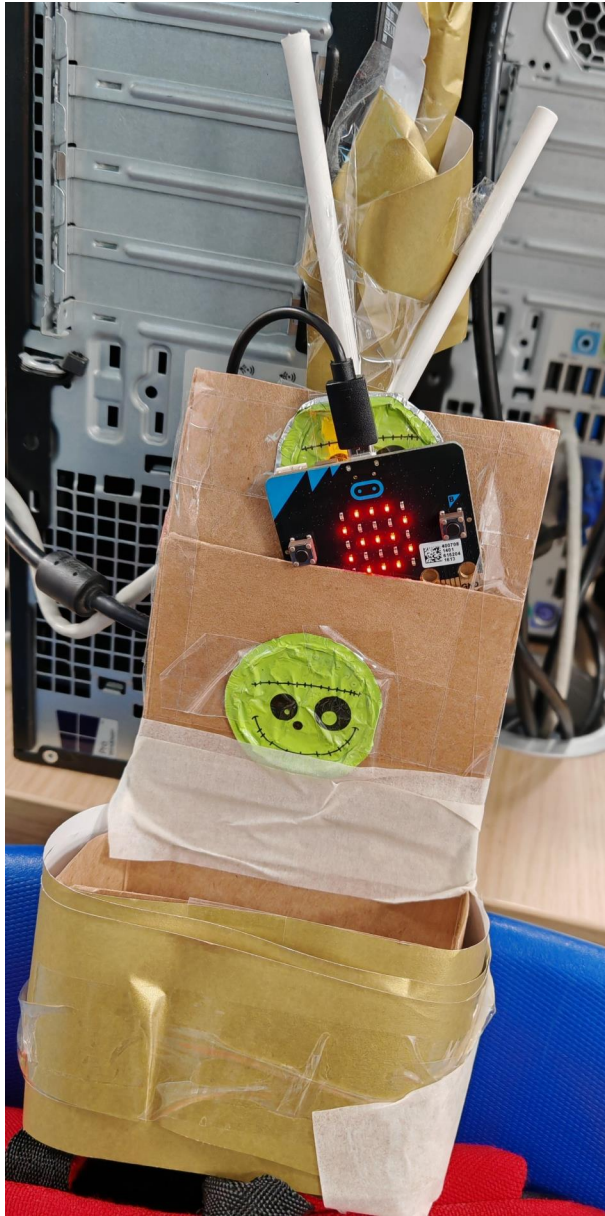
Computing Club

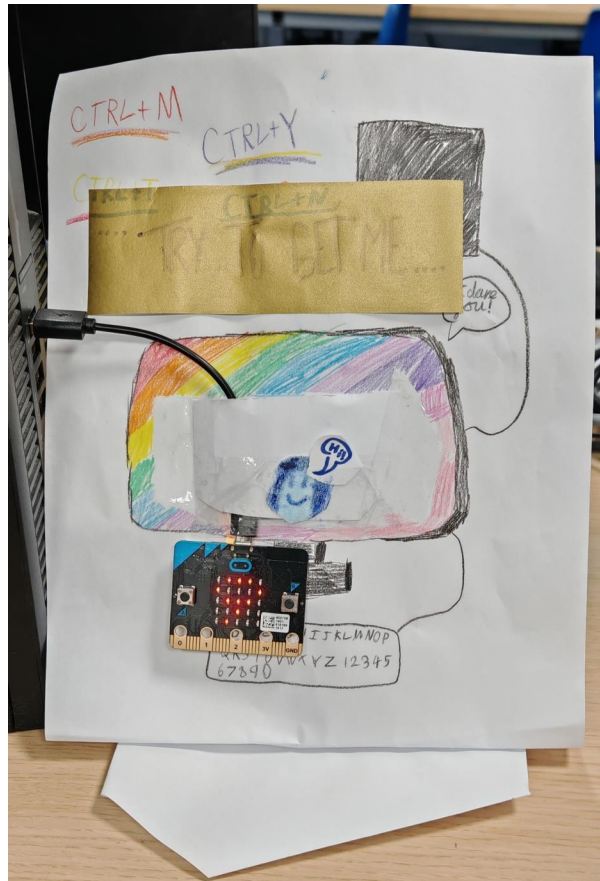

THE FIRST EVER PROGRAMMER WAS A WOMAN

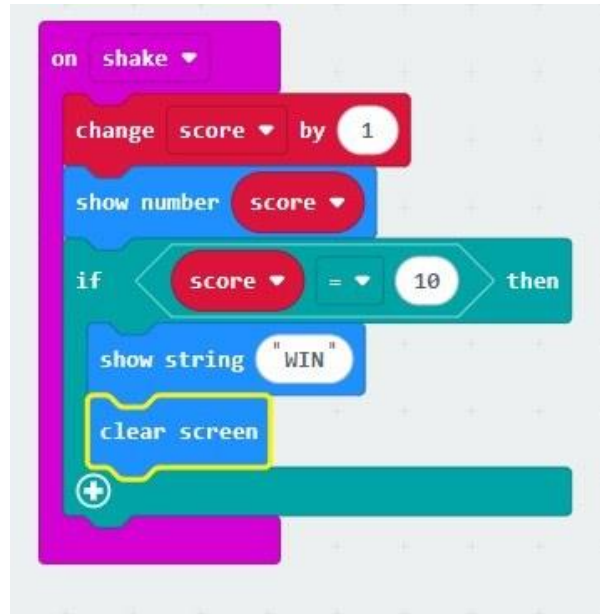
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Her name was Ada Lovelace, a mathematician and also daughter of the English poet Lord Byron.

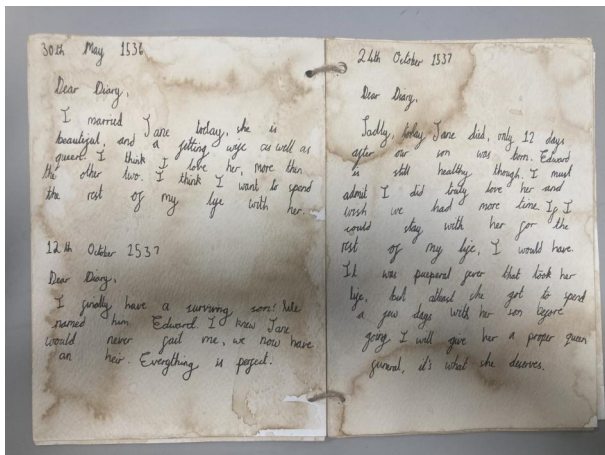
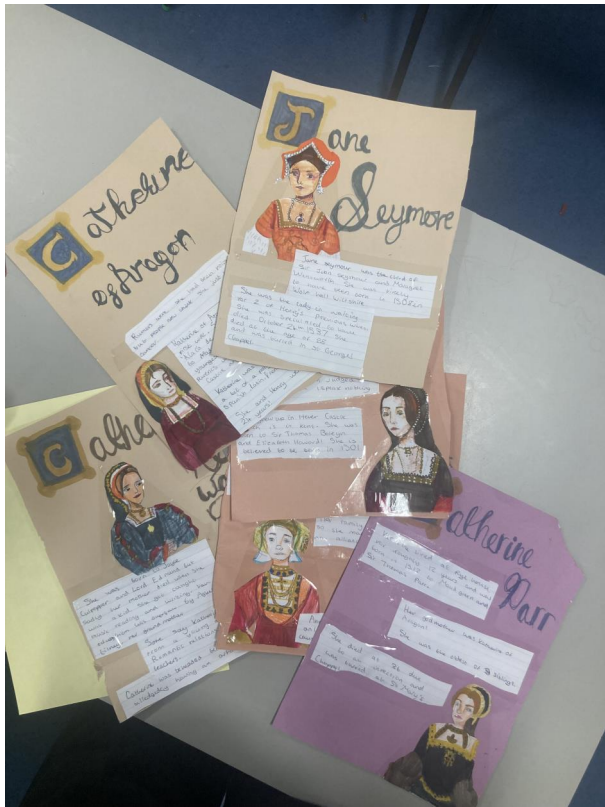
Guest speakers for Year 11

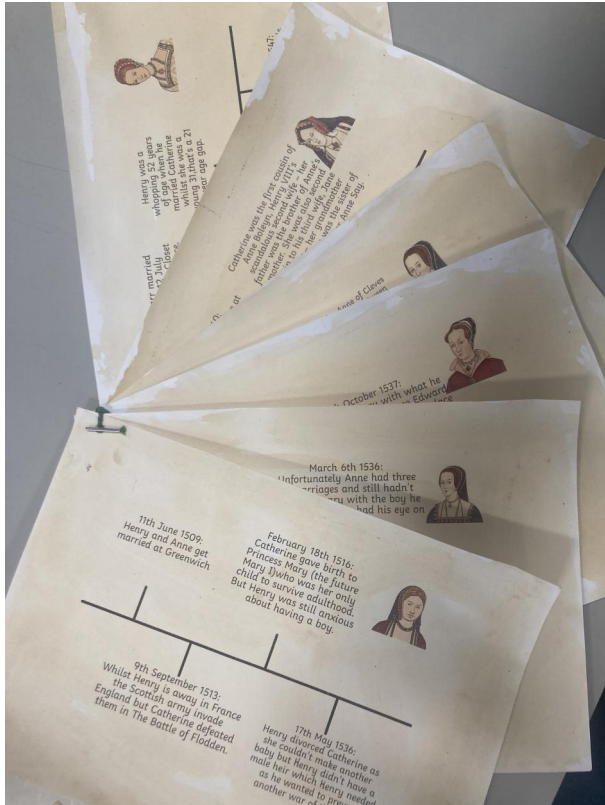

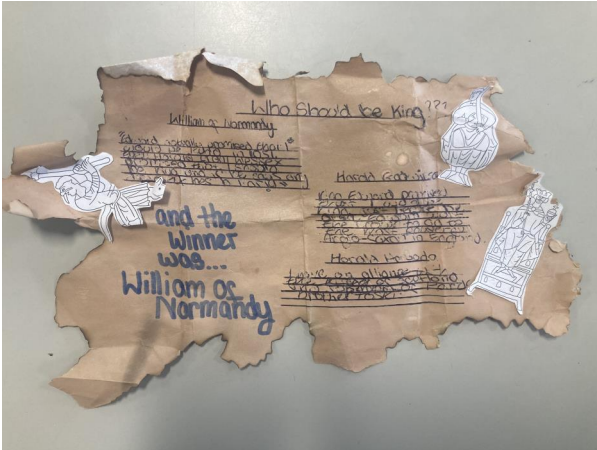
