Why have a school uniform?

- It projects a professional image of the school, promoting a strong sense of identity.
- It supports a culture of high expectations by reinforcing structure, routine and pride in personal appearance—habits that often translate into improved behaviour and focus.
- It reduces visible signs of economic and social differences, helping to create a level playing field and reduce peer pressure related to brands or trends, promoting equality.
- Everyone wearing the same uniform fosters cohesion and wider sense of belonging.
- It makes students more easily identifiable, supporting safeguarding.



Our school uniform

- Grey blazer with red trim and school emblem
- White shirt
- Grey tie with red stripes and school emblem
- Grey V-neck jumper (optional)
- Black trousers or tartan skirt with black opaque tights
- Plain black, grey or white socks
- Plain black, polishable school shoes
- Sturdy school bag which can hold an A4 folder



Make-up, jewellery and accessories

Make-up

- Discreet, natural tones of concealer or foundation only—no mascara, false eyelashes, eye shadow or eye liner, lip products (sticks, glosses and liners), blush, bronzer or highlighter
- Fake tan is not permitted
- Nails must be short and natural—no gel, biab, false nails or brightly coloured nail varnish

Jewellery

- One small, gold or silver stud in each earlobe—no other jewellery or piercings are to be worn
- Wristwatch—smartwatches will be confiscated in line with the school's mobile phone policy

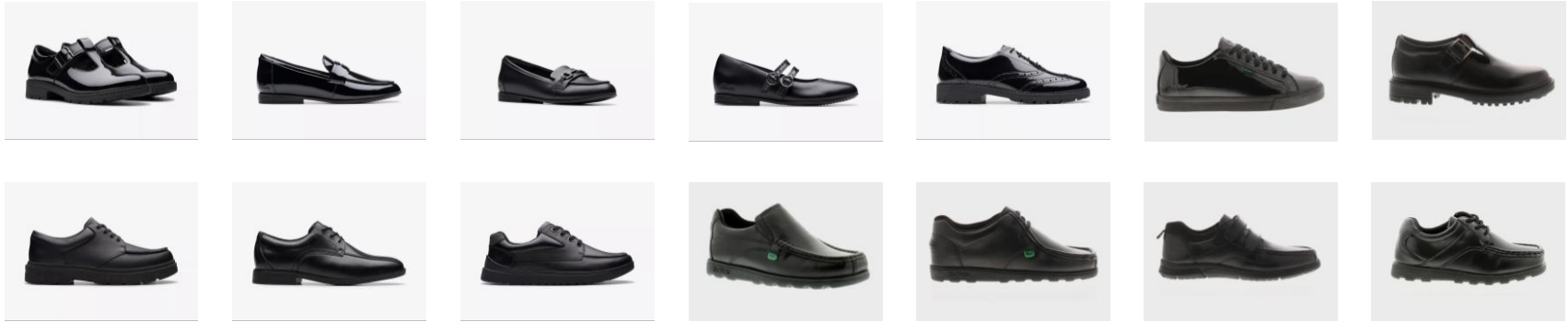
Accessories

- Grips, bobbles and headbands must be in keeping with the school uniform (plain black, grey, red)—no fashion clips, bows or ribbons
- Only badges issued or approved by the school can be worn



School shoes

School shoes must be plain black and polishable and in keeping with the styles pictured.



Trainers are not permitted—wide-fit and orthopaedic school shoes are available

Boots, platforms, wedges, ballerina shoes or shoes with ornamentation (bows/floral decorations/ribbons) are not permitted.



Jewellery

- One small, gold or silver stud in each earlobe—no hoops, shaped studs, studs with diamonds.
- A wristwatch can be worn—smartwatches will be confiscated in line with the mobile phone policy.



Any non-permitted items will be confiscated and returned to the student at the end of the week. However, if the jewellery is confiscated on a Thursday or Friday, it will be returned at the end of the following week.

Why have essential equipment?

- Having the right equipment builds independence, personal responsibility, and organisation, which are all key skills for learning.
- Readiness to learn helps to prevent delayed lesson starts and minimises disruption caused by students not having the necessary equipment.
- When everyone has their own equipment, especially glue sticks and pencil crayons, it reduces time spent waiting and allows lessons to run more smoothly.
